## Purpose:

This document provides a summarized list of the <u>internationally recognized human rights</u> that are especially relevant for online platforms. These are sourced from the rights expressed in the "<u>International Bill of Human Rights</u>" and relevant thematic conventions, such as the <u>Convention on the Rights of the Child</u>, <u>Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Racial Discrimination</u>, and the <u>Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities</u>. It also includes two rights more recently established by the United Nations—the <u>right to a healthy environment</u> and the right to internet access.

This list is intended to be used as a foundation for identifying human rights risks by considering how each right could be impacted by your products/services or in a specific situation or geographic context. Note that not all rights listed will be relevant in every case.
